Although we have not been able to hold our Festivals in 2021 and 2022 we have kept in touch and with the support of Greenock Telegraph we launched a search for some new supporters. This brought a number of people who will be involved in a variety of ways.

You will have noticed that this year there were no adult classes at the festival. For this reason, our closing concert will feature several of our stalwarts and Inverclyde Voices, Clydeside Singers and The Belles of Notre Dame have agreed to take part.

Our adjudicators, accompanists, audience and performers are vital to the festival and we welcome each one of you to Inverclyde Festival 2023.

THIS YEAR'S ADJUDICATORS

Ben Costello

Ben is a freelance musical director, artistic director, adjudicator, singing coach and accompanist, working internationally. He is also Artistic Director of Thames Concerts, Musical Director of Southampton Choral Society, Founding Director of Kingston Chamber Singers, Chorus Master for the Leith Hill Musical Festival, and on the faculty at Laine Theatre Arts, also making regular visits to Mountview Academy and Trinity Laban. He has been an adjudicator member of the Federation since 2009.

As an accompanist and coach Ben collaborates with numerous singers and instrumentalists. His early career included répétiteur work for London opera companies, and ensembles including the London Symphony Orchestra. He is a specialist in musical theatre, with his work in that field embracing musical direction, singing teaching, accompanying and dramaturgy.

Ben has worked extensively for almost all of the leading London performing arts colleges, together with the Royal Academy of Music, and the London College of Music (where he was resident MD for seven years). Countless of his former students enjoy successful careers in London's West End and beyond.

Born and based in London, Ben trained initially as a flautist, before majoring in piano, singing and conducting. He is a Liveryman of the Worshipful Company of Musicians, organising and chairing the Company's annual musical direction scholarship. Outside of music he is a keen motorcyclist.

Richard Deering

Richard has been an adjudicator member of the British and International Federation of Festivals for well over 30 years, adjudicating at an average of 12 festivals a year, including many overseas festivals, as a piano or brass specialist and generalist.

Although no longer active as a performing brass player, he has given piano performances – as soloist and accompanist – in over 90 countries and has held teaching positions in establishments such as London College of Music, Trinity College of Music, Middlesex University, Cambridge University, Auckland University and New York State University. Richard was also an Adviser to the London Arts Board on contemporary music and jazz.

His Federation work included serving on the Central Board of Trustees, Vice-Chair of the Adjudicator's Council and with the administration of the PGCA qualification.

Currently he is the Chair of Trustees of Croydon Performing Arts Festival and, was honoured, by being elected as a BIFF Fellow in 2012.

Richard is also a high-ranking cricket umpire and season ticket holder at Sutton United Football Club.

Judey Struth

Judey has been involved with Festivals as a performer, teacher and parent for over 50 years. She is an Associate of Trinity College, London. Her passion is poetry - Scots in particular - and as an adjudicator she wants to encourage teachers, parents and children to support their local Festivals and discover the fun and tremendous life-skills to be gained through performance, and is happy to adjudicate in person or online.

Jimmie Hill

Jimmie Hill comes from Millport and learned country dancing both at primary school there and at Rothesay Academy. He qualified as an RSCDS country dance teacher 25 years ago.

While living in England he founded the Brighton Branch of the RSCDS. Back home in Edinburgh, he taught the Edinburgh University demonstration team, which regularly competed at the Newcastle Festival.

He has taught at the RSCDS Summer and Winter Schools, at day and weekend schools in the UK and Europe, and has been invited regularly to teach in North America.

In 2019 he taught in New York, Calgary and Seattle. He is the current Editor of *Scottish Country Dancer*, the RSCDS members' magazine. He is a qualified RSCDS adjudicator and has judged at the Aberdeen, Dumfries, Arran, and Glasgow Festivals.

James Wark

Jim Wark is paying his regular visit to Inverclyde Festival, as adjudicator in our Piping classes. He is a former Pipe Major of the Strathclyde Police Pipe Band and has extensive experience as a solo piper, band member and adjudicator.

He is heavily involved in the RSPBA education programme, running courses for young pipers in a variety of centres in Scotland. He is much in demand as an adjudicator and his judgement has been highly respected in competitions in Scotland, England, Ireland and the USA.

Calum Huggan

From early on in his career Calum showed a real passion for marimba, winning his first BBC Solo Broadcast at the young age of 18.

A finalist in International and National competitions, Calum was taught and nurtured by International Marimbist's Jasmin Kolberg and Eric Sammut. Calum's passion and commitment to performing has allowed him to perform solo and concerto debuts within the major concert houses across the United Kingdom, Europe and the United Arab Emirates.

As a freelance percussionist, Calum works regularly with orchestras such as BBC Scottish Symphony Orchestra, English National Opera – Bayliss, Southbank Sinfonia, Scottish Ensemble, Scottish Opera, Mannheim National Theatre . As well as being a virtuosic performer, Calum's passion lies in cross-arts collaborations and teaching. He has worked alongside some of the most recognised and talented creatives in the arts.

Calum is an active and sought after percussion tutor and workshop leader throughout the UK, Four Mallet Specialist at Trinity Laban Conservatoire of Music and Dance, Percussion and Ensemble coach at Junior Trinity (London) and a part time lecturer at the Royal Conservatoire of Scotland.

Eilidh Cormack

Eilidh Cormack is a Gaelic singer from the Isle of Skye, brought up in a Gaelic-speaking family.

She won the Ladies' Mòd Gold Medal in 2014, at the age of 18, and was a semi-finalist in the BBC Scotland Young Traditional Musician of the Year. She sings regularly at cèilidhs and other events in the city. She also sings with SIAN, a new force in Gaelic song primarily singing the songs of Gaelic women.

She also tutors Còisir G, the Highland Young Musicians' regional Gaelic choir in Inverness alongside Eilidh Mackenzie. We are pleased to have Eilidh for her third visit.

Gerry Magee

Guitarist Gerry Magee graduated with honours from Strathclyde University's BA in Applied Music Course in 1998. Since then he has been involved in numerous music projects, be it virtuoso playing in a heavy metal band, arranging for a nine piece funk band or working with small jazz ensembles. Gerry's skills are continually in demand as both a performer and session musician.

For the past 17 years Gerry has also taught guitar at high schools throughout West Dunbartonshire. Many of his students have gone on to become professional musicians themselves.

Rana Keane

Rana Keane has had a long career in education from teacher to Head Teacher to nearly 20 years within the Education Services of Renfrewshire Council in various advisory roles, including responsibility for the areas of Art and Design, Drama and Music across the sectors.

Rana's love of the Expressive Arts may have begun when she started piano lessons at the age of 5! However it became a more important part of her life when invited to join the Drama Club while a student, which encouraged her to major in Drama and American Literature.

COPYRIGHT:

The Inverclyde Music Festival is pleased to announce that it has entered into an agreement with the Authors' Licensing and Collecting Society. This means that entrants do not have to seek copyright permission for any poetry, prose or solo dramatic items performed, to a time limit of 10 minutes.

Performers and teachers will be delighted to know that their participation in the Festival means that authors will be directly reimbursed as a consequence of their work being performed at this Festival.

Duologues and group dramatic activity are not covered by this agreement, and copyright for these items should be sought by performers at the time of entry.

Solo dramatic items must be announced with title and author at the time of performance to qualify for copyright indemnity, and the performer must not change the words or gender of the character.

All performances using music from shows in current production are subject to copyright law.

Songs from shows in current production may be sung as a concert item, i.e. with no costume or movement without need for copyright permission.

Where movement or costumes are included in a performance, copyright permission is required and the Festival Committee accepts these entries on the basis that the appropriate copyright permission has been sought.

Performers or teachers with queries on how to obtain copyright permission for performance items should contact Festivals House on 01625 428 297 or 01625 611 578 before making their entries.

RECORDING AND PHOTOGRAPHY:

The use of video, audio recording equipment or flash photography is not permitted during performances

CHILD PROTECTION POLICY

Inverclyde Music Festival has a Child Protection Policy approved by the British and International Federation of Festivals. It aims to inform and involve parents, guardians, carers and teachers in partnership in order to ensure, as far as is reasonably practicable, a safe environment at the Festival. Competing groups must be accompanied by the correct ratio of supervisory adults.

All sponsors of competitors will be notified of the Policy. They will also be informed of the date, time and venue of the class entered. Particular attention will be drawn to the requirement that, where parents, guardians or carers are not personally attending with their children, it is their responsibility to ensure that their children are accompanied and adequately supervised at the Festival by responsible adults acting on their behalf.

Festival personnel will be chosen by the Committee and during the Festival all Committee Members and volunteers will be identified by the wearing of suitable badges. Anyone wearing a badge can be approached and will be able to give directions to someone who will deal with any problem.

Adjudicators

Richard Deering

Richard has been an adjudicator member of the British and International Federation of Festivals for well over 30 years, adjudicating at an average of 12 festivals a year, including many overseas festivals, as a piano or brass specialist and generalist.

Although no longer active as a performing brass player, he has given piano performances - as soloist and accompanist - in over 90 countries and has held teaching positions in establishments such as London College of Music, Trinity College of Music, Middlesex University, Cambridge University, Auckland University and New York State University. Richard was also an Adviser to the London Arts Board on contemporary music and jazz.

His Federation work included serving on the Central Board of Trustees, Vice-Chair of the Adjudicator's Council and with the administration of the PGCA qualification.

Currently he is the Chair of Trustees of Croydon Performing Arts Festival and, was honoured, by being elected as a BIFF Fellow in 2012.

Richard is also a high-ranking cricket umpire and season ticket holder at Sutton United Football Club.

Eilidh Cormack

Eilidh Cormack is a Gaelic singer from the Isle of Skye, brought up in a Gaelic-speaking family. She won the Ladies' Mòd Gold Medal in 2014, at the age of 18, and was a semi-finalist in the BBC Scotland Young Traditional Musician of the Year. She sings regularly at cèilidhs and other events in the city. She also sings with SIAN, a new force in Gaelic song primarily singing the songs of Gaelic women. She also tutors Còisir G, the Highland Young Musicians' regional Gaelic choir in Inverness alongside Eilidh Mackenzie. We are pleased to have Eilidh for her third visit.

Rana Keane

Rana Keane has had a long career in education from teacher to Head Teacher to nearly 20 years within the Education Services of Renfrewshire Council in various advisory roles, including responsibility for the areas of Art and Design, Drama and Music across the sectors.

Rana's love of the Expressive Arts may have begun when she started piano lessons at the age of 5! However it became a more important part of her life when invited to join the Drama Club while a student, which encouraged her to major in Drama and American Literature.

As a teacher and Head Teacher Rana always tried to promote a love and enthusiasm for the arts in both her pupils and her colleagues. Throughout her career she has been firmly convinced of the positive benefits of involvement in the arts for children, supporting them to develop positive self-esteem, self-discipline, effective organisational skills and become trustworthy members of teams - AND have lots of fun and enjoyment!

Ben Costello

Ben is a freelance musical director, artistic director, adjudicator, singing coach and accompanist, working internationally. He is also Artistic Director of Thames Concerts, Musical Director of Southampton Choral Society, Founding Director of Kingston Chamber Singers, Chorus Master for the Leith Hill Musical Festival, and on the faculty at Laine Theatre Arts, also making regular visits to Mountview Academy and Trinity Laban. He has been an adjudicator member of the Federation since 2009.

As an accompanist and coach Ben collaborates with numerous singers and instrumentalists. His early career included répétiteur work for London opera companies, and ensembles including the London Symphony Orchestra. He is a specialist in musical theatre, with his work in that field embracing musical direction, singing teaching, accompanying and dramaturgy.

Ben has worked extensively for almost all of the leading London performing arts colleges, together with the Royal Academy of Music, and the London College of Music (where he was resident MD for seven years). Countless of his former students enjoy successful careers in London's West End and beyond.

Born and based in London, Ben trained initially as a flautist, before majoring in piano, singing and conducting. He is a Liveryman of the Worshipful Company of Musicians, organising and chairing the Company's annual musical direction scholarship. Outside of music he is a keen motorcyclist.

Ben Costello

Ben is a freelance musical director, artistic director, adjudicator, singing coach and accompanist, working internationally. He is also Artistic Director of Thames Concerts, Musical Director of Southampton Choral Society, Founding Director of Kingston Chamber Singers, Chorus Master for the Leith Hill Musical Festival, and on the faculty at Laine Theatre Arts, also making regular visits to Mountview Academy and Trinity Laban. He has been an adjudicator member of the Federation since 2009.

As an accompanist and coach Ben collaborates with numerous singers and instrumentalists. His early career included répétiteur work for London opera companies, and ensembles including the London Symphony Orchestra. He is a specialist in musical theatre, with his work in that field embracing musical direction, singing teaching, accompanying and dramaturgy.
