PROGRESSING 70 - 74	A performance showing development of technique and/or communication and commitment.	A generally secure performance in notes and rhythm at a reasonable tempo but as yet with limited attention to detail, tonal qualities, and style.
MERIT 75 - 79	A competent performance, showing some artistic awareness and/or technical ability.	Mostly fluent and accurate, with some awareness of tone and style, but requiring a sense of communication and performance.
Commended 80 - 84	A convincing performance technically & artistically, with increasing stylistic & communication skills.	Confident, with clear evidence of tonal and stylistic qualities and a developing awareness of communication and performance, although there may be moments of imprecision.
HONOURS 85 - 89	An excellent performance, demonstrating fluent technical and artistic skills with emerging individuality.	Assured and expressive, demonstrating a high level of technical security, imagination and stylistic insight and with a real sense of communication and performance, although small blemishes may be present.
OUTSTANDING 90 - 94	An impressive performance technically and artistically, displaying spontaneity & clear individuality.	A stimulating, imaginative and persuasive performance, showing stylistic flair, interpretative insight, poise and unobtrusive technical command.
EXCEPTIONAL 95 +	A superlative performance, displaying exceptional artistic individuality	An astonishingly impressive performance displaying effortless technical control and superlative individuality in its artistry, and profound musical insight.


# Jonathan Rea



Jonathan studied music at Cambridge, where he sang in the University Chamber Choir and studied piano with Peter Pettinger. He held choral and instrumental awards and won the Rima Alamuddin prize for piano performance.

After 10 happy years as Director of Music in Bangor Grammar School, he began a broader career in conducting, producing, writing, composing, arranging and piano accompanying. He has conducted many programmes for BBC Songs of Praise and directed the Belfast choir for Children in Need. For several years he was the Principal Examiner for A-Level Music Performance in Northern Ireland. He is the choral director for the annual Sing! conference in Nashville, for whom he has on two occasions directed choirs with 1000 participants. He now provides consultancy to a number of church-based organisations.

Jonathan is Creative Director and Chief Executive of New Irish Arts, whose choir, orchestra and youth choir perform at over 20 events per year. They have sold out Belfast's Waterfront Hall on numerous occasions, and often have over 250 participants in their larger concerts. Jonathan is increasingly in demand as a writer and speaker, occasionally contributing to programmes like Radio 4's Prayer for the Day and Morning Service.



# Ben Costello




Ben is a freelance musical director, singing coach, accompanist and adjudicator, working internationally. He is Artistic Director of the prestigious London concert series Thames Concerts, a long-standing and busy generalist music adjudicator for the British and International Federation of Festivals, and Music Chairman of the Adjudicators' Council. He is also an examiner and consultant for London College of Music Examinations.

Ben is widely regarded as a specialist in musical theatre. A reflective product of this is his continuing work at the cutting edge of performing arts training including at Arts Ed, Mountview, LAMDA, GSA, LSMT, Trinity Laban, Laine Theatre Arts, Drama Studio London, Italia Conti, and the Royal Academy of Music.

Born in London, Ben read Music at Kingston University and the London College of Music, subsequently joining the College's faculty as their first resident MD. He is a Liveryman and Court Member of the Worshipful Company of Musicians and chairs the Company's jazz committee.

Outside music he is a keen motorcyclist and wine bore. Ben is delighted to be back adjudicating in Greenock and wishes all the performers every success.





Judey has been involved with Festivals as a performer, teacher and parent for over 50 years. She is an Associate of Trinity College, London.

Her passion is poetry - Scots in particular - and as an adjudicator she wants to encourage teachers, parents and children to support their local Festivals and discover the fun and tremendous life-skills to be gained through performance, and is happy to adjudicate in person or online.



# Jimmie Hill



Jimmie comes from Millport and learned country dancing both at primary school there and at Rothesay Academy. He qualified as an RSCDS country dance teacher 25 years ago.

While living in England he founded the Brighton Branch of the RSCDS. Back home in Edinburgh, he taught the Edinburgh University demonstration team, which regularly competed at the Newcastle Festival. He has taught at the RSCDS Summer and Winter Schools, at day and weekend schools in the UK and Europe, and has been invited regularly to teach in North America. In 2019 he taught in New York, Calgary and Seattle. He is the current editor of Scottish Country Dancer, the RSCDS members' magazine. He is a qualified RSCDS adjudicator and has judged at the Aberdeen, Dumfries, Arran, and Glasgow Festivals.

From early on in his career Calum showed a real passion for marimba, winning his first BBC Solo Broadcast at the young age of 18. A finalist in International and National competitions, Calum was taught and nurtured by international marimbists Jasmin Kolberg and Eric Sammut. Calum's passion and commitment to performing has allowed him to perform solo and concerto debuts within the major concert houses across the United Kingdom, Europe and the United Arab Emirates.

As a freelance percussionist, Calum works regularly with orchestras such as BBC Scottish Symphony Orchestra, English National Opera Bayliss, Southbank Sinfonia, Scottish Ensemble, Scottish Opera, Mannheim National Theatre.

Calum is an active and sought after percussion tutor and workshop leader throughout the UK, Four Mallet Specialist at Trinity Laban Conservatoire of Music and Dance, Percussion and Ensemble coach at Junior Trinity (London) and a part time lecturer at the Royal Conservatoire of Scotland.



Guitarist Gerry Magee graduated with honours from Strathclyde University's BA in Applied Music Course in 1998. Since then he has been involved in numerous music projects, be it virtuoso playing in a heavy metal band, arranging for a nine piece funk band or working with small jazz ensembles. Gerry's skills are continually in demand as both a performer and session musician.

For the past 17 years Gerry has also taught guitar at high schools throughout West Dunbartonshire. Many of his students have gone on to become professional musicians themselves.

Colin is a professional drummer and educator from Glasgow. With nearly 30 years of experience, Colin covers everything from theatre pit work, touring shows including national tours with Susan Boyle, Jai McDowall and Federation of the Disco Pimp to rock/pop/jazz gigs and studio recording sessions.

Colin also teaches in local authority primary and secondary schools in Glasgow and Renfrewshire, giving Drumkit/percussion lessons to around 140 pupils each week. Colin is a Los Cabos Drumsticks and Cosmic Ears endorsee.
